Capability

The CVR(T) is a family of agile, mobile armoured vehicles. Its variants have the ability to fulfil a wide range of scouting and combat missions, as well as a number of support and logistics tasks. Its exceptionally low ground pressure provides outstanding mobility across difficult terrain. Combined with air transportability, easy to maintain design and reliability, the vehicle provides a strategic and tactical advantage for a range of missions.

Functionality

CVR(T)'s primary role is to provide reconnaissance ahead of the main Battle Group. Its low silhouette and reduced noise level make it ideal for reconnaissance by stealth. Its ability to extract at speed – it can reach 80kmh in either forward or reverse – while delivering firepower also means the vehicle can quickly remove itself from hazardous situations if required.

CVR(T)'s high speed and manoeuvrability makes it ideal for reconnaissance and transporting infantry, air defence section and mortar fire controllers as well as providing vital battlefield capabilities including ambulances, armoured command vehicles and armoured recovery vehicles. The Fire Support variant is fitted with either a 30mm, 76mm or 90mm main armament along with a 7.26mm General Purpose Machine Gun, giving it significant firepower if required.

Battle-proven performance

Upgrades

Upgraded vehicles are available with Mine Blast protection and Ballistic protection panels to improve safety levels. A further suite of upgrades also remain available to improve protection, engage targets more quickly and improve environmental control with heating and air conditioning. A new hull can also better protect against mine blasts and IEDs in addition to a variety of other protection and mobility improvements.
